1. Single News Types: use only corporate/mainstream media on the political side with which they affiliate.


2. All News Types: sample all categories of media daily --- left and right, corporate/mainstream and independent/citizen journalists, primary sources.





Individual Level

1. Deprives us of total set of facts

2. Divides us into mutually-exclusive realities

3. Makes political dialogue impossible

4. Antagonizes us from friends and family

How do we find the truth?

Make a daily habit of consuming news from both liberal and conservative, mainstream and independent, news outlets.

Over time, learn the general tendencies of each outlet --- their viewpoints, narratives, censorship focus, fabrications, smears, etc.

Identify factual discrepancies

Do research to reconcile the discrepancies

 Use primary sources whenever possible



How do we bridge the polarized divide?

Try to wake up others

1. Share these insights with others.

2. Share news items with others that challenge the news they're receiving.

3. Share primary sources with others.

4. Challenge others to do their own analysis and generate their own conclusion.
