Woke Insanity: Hawley States Only Women Can Get Pregnant. UC Prof, Abortion Rights Advocate, Calls Him 'Transphobic'

In a contentious exchange in which an abortion rights advocate and law professor acted patronizingly toward Missouri GOP Senator Josh Hawley, who asked whether her phrase "people with a capacity for pregnancy" simply meant women, the professor accused him of being "transphobic."

University of California at Berkeley Law professor Khiara Bridges appeared at a hearing held by the Senate Judiciary Committee to examine legal concerns following the Supreme Court decision that overturned *Roe v Wade*.

"Professor Bridges, you've said several times; you've used a phrase; I just want to make sure I understand what you mean by it. You've referred to 'people with a capacity for pregnancy," Hawley pointed out, then asked bluntly. "Would that be women?"
